Re. Certified analysis for contaminants, toxic metals and microbial pathogens in Seagreens® Ascophyllum nodosum (knotted wrack), Fucus spiralis (spiral wrack), and Pelvetia canaliculata (channel wrack).

We can confirm that "from all the tests carried out (by Research Fellows of this University), we see no reason that the product would not be safe to consume within the regulatory definition of food safety for human consumption. The product has satisfied all the requirements as regards determination of regularly examined toxins and shown that they are absent.
